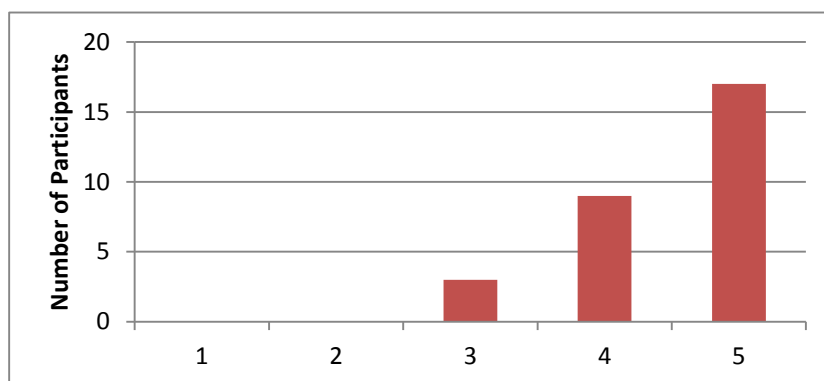
At the end of the workshop, participants were asked to provide feedback on the workshop by answering the following questions:

2. Overview of aspects or topics of the workshop the participants found most interesting or useful:

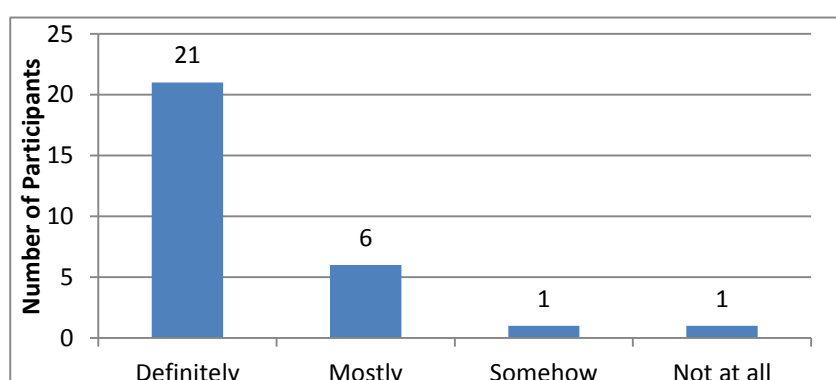
- Understanding of environment and biodiversity

6. Overview of how participants thought the workshop could have been more effective:

- Increase the length of the workshop (to transfer more knowledge) – 3 to 5 days
- Workshop venue was deemed appropriate to the area/topics raised
- More practical work– more emphasis on participants to action and implement the knowledge gained from the workshop
- Participation of higher level officials of the City Administration in the workshop (and future workshops)
